



## STALLARD OPERATING SPECTACLES





These Operating Spectacles, designed by Mr. H. B. Stallard, F.R.C.S., were the subject of an article by him in the British Journal of Ophthalmology, October, 1950. They present the following advantages:—

(1) When the extension carrying the lenses is swung upwards in front of the forehead, there is no obstruction below or to the sides of the operator's field of view. (2) The lenses, being placed well in front of the operator's nose and the plane of his mask, never become steamed over. (3) The spectacles are very light and comfortable, exerting the minimum of pressure on nose and ears. (4) They can be folded flat into a small space.



## The Best of the Old . . . . .




Under full sail
