#### USES

Sodium hyaluronate is a visco-elastic polymer normally found in the aqueous and vitreous humour. HEALONID, which contains sodium hyaluronate is a highly viscous clear solution at rest, yet it will readily flow through a fine cannula or needle under pressure. # GLAUCOMA. What is the best measure of successful control over time?

'Since the aim of treatment is to prevent loss of visual field, any definitive assessment of therapeutic benefit should logically be based on field survival.'

#### USES

#### DOSAGE AND ADMINISTRATION

Usually one drop 0.25% solution in affected eye twice a day. If necessary change to one drop 0.5% solution twice a day.

#### CONTRA-INDICATIONS

Known contra-indications to systemic use of beta-blockers require caution. These include sinus bradycardia, greater than first-degree block; cardiogenic shock; diabetes.
Cardiac failure should be adequately controlled before prescribing. History of severe cardiac disease requires monitoring for cardiac failure and checking of pulse rates. There have been reports of skin rashes and/or dry eyes associated with beta-blocking drugs; discontinuation should be considered.

Patients receiving a beta-blocker orally and 'Timoptol' may experience an additive effect on IOP or on known systemic effects of beta-blockade.

#### SIDE EFFECTS

Ocular irritation, including conjunctivitis, blepharitis, and keratitis, reported occasionally. Visual disturbances reported infrequently. Rash and urticaria reported rarely. Certain cardiovascular, pulmonary and other disorders reported, including bradyarrhythmia, hypotension, syncope, and bronchospasm. Respiratory failure, congestive heart failure and, in diabetics, masked symptoms of hypoglycaemia reported rarely. Slight reduction in resting heart rate observed.

Rare effects reported are aphabic cystoid macular oedema, headache, dry mouth, anorexia, dyspepsia, nausea, dizziness, CNS effects, palpitation, and hypertension.
