

POST-OPERATIVE GOGGLES



Designed by Mr. Williamson-Noble and described by him in the August, 1950, issue of the British Journal of Ophthalmology to meet the need for a light, comfortable and inexpensive dark goggle for the exclusion of extraneous light after intraocular operations. The sides are fine wire mesh affording adequate ventilation and the fastening tapes are long enough to be tied at the side of the head to prevent discomfort to the patient lying in bed. They are made in three densities; pale, medium and dark.




Bodiam Castle
